In October 1997 MRG will publish a new report under the title:
War:

The Impact on Minority and Indigenous Children. Based on background research that MRG contributed to the UNICEF Machel Study on The Impact of Armed Conflict on Children (1996), the report features three major case studies: on Jumma children of the Chittagong Hill Tracts, Bangladesh; Maya children of Guatemala; and minority children of Somalia.

Two key issues emerged from our studies: (1) minority children may be deliberately targeted by governmental forces and paramilitaries during internal armed conflicts; and (2) minority communities and their children are often overlooked during the delivery of humanitarian aid and during post-conflict reconstruction.

A short summary of the report will be available electronically to CRIN members soon. We will also distribute copies of the printed report free to appropriate organizations and individuals in each of the case-study regions and (a more limited number) elsewhere.

We are developing a database of organizations and individuals to send the published report to, and we have included very many of the organizations listed in the CRIN Membership Directory Edition One

March 1997.
